Dear Director Phipps:

The Department of Human Services (DHS) is seeking a walver as described in 11 lowa Administrative Code (IAC) Section 118.16 regarding the contract for operations of the lowa Medicald Enterprise's Non-Emergency Medical Transportation (NEMT), MED-10-011. Specifically, lowa Medicald seeks a walver of the six-year contract limitation set forth in IAC 118.11(3) applicable to service contracts. DHS is applying for this walver because it is in the best interest of the taxpayers to option the existing contract for an actificing also makes due to unforeseen delays in the re-procurement process.

The current NEMT Services contract was first executed on October 1, 2010, and is set to expire on June 30, 2016. I low Medicaid had released a request for proposals (RFP) on July 31, 2014, and the Department was in the process of evaluating the bid proposals, when Governor Branstad announced the move to Medicaid modernization in January 2015. With this announcement, the Department withdrew the RFP, as NEMT services were listed as a covered service under managed care. DHS is requesting an extension to allow sufficient time to release a new RFP that only includes the Medicaid fee for-service population, and for a new contract to be put into place. The extension requested is for a maximum period of 12 months, through June 30, 2017.

Thank you for your consideration of this waiver of IAC 118.11(3) on the grounds that it is not in the best interest of the taxpayers to maintain a six year limit.
