Setting Chrome to open a PDF in Adobe Acrobat after downloading

Interactive PDQs, like the new version of the PDQ, will not open correctly in Google Chrome's built-in PDF viewer and must be opened in Adobe Acrobat. To open PDFs automatically in Adobe Acrobat from your Chrome window, you must first ensure that Adobe Acrobat is set as your default system viewer for .pdf files. If you need help changing your default application, please call the OCIO Service Desk. (Note: Alternatively, you may instead download the file, right click on it, select "Open with," and select Adobe Acrobat from the available options; however, you would need to do this each and every time.)

Now when you receive a PDF in an email and you click download, when you click the ^ next to the file name at the bottom of your browser window, you have an option to click "Open with System Viewer." The "system viewer" referred to here is different than the built-in Chrome PDF viewer. Opening a downloaded PDF file in the system viewer will open the PDF in your Adobe Acrobat viewer so long as it is set as the default viewer for files with the .pdf file extension. The downloaded file remains in your Chrome downloads folder, and you can save it there after you edit it, or to any drive location you prefer.
